The program covers technical, leadership, business, and strategic management subjects with an emphasis on understanding and managing change as applied to project management.

- 8. reflect on different perspectives to aid decision-making, challenge personal assumptions, and encourage the expression of all points of view:
- adapt leadership practices to meet the needs and perspectives of interested parties from diverse backgrounds and industry sectors;
- 10. align project management practices and leadership strategies to manage relationships, resolve conflict, establish motivation, and promote positive organizational change;
- 11. employ eco-friendly practices to promote resource and cost efficiencies;
- 12. employ an entrepreneurial mindset to identify, research, communicate, and/or respond to new opportunities.
